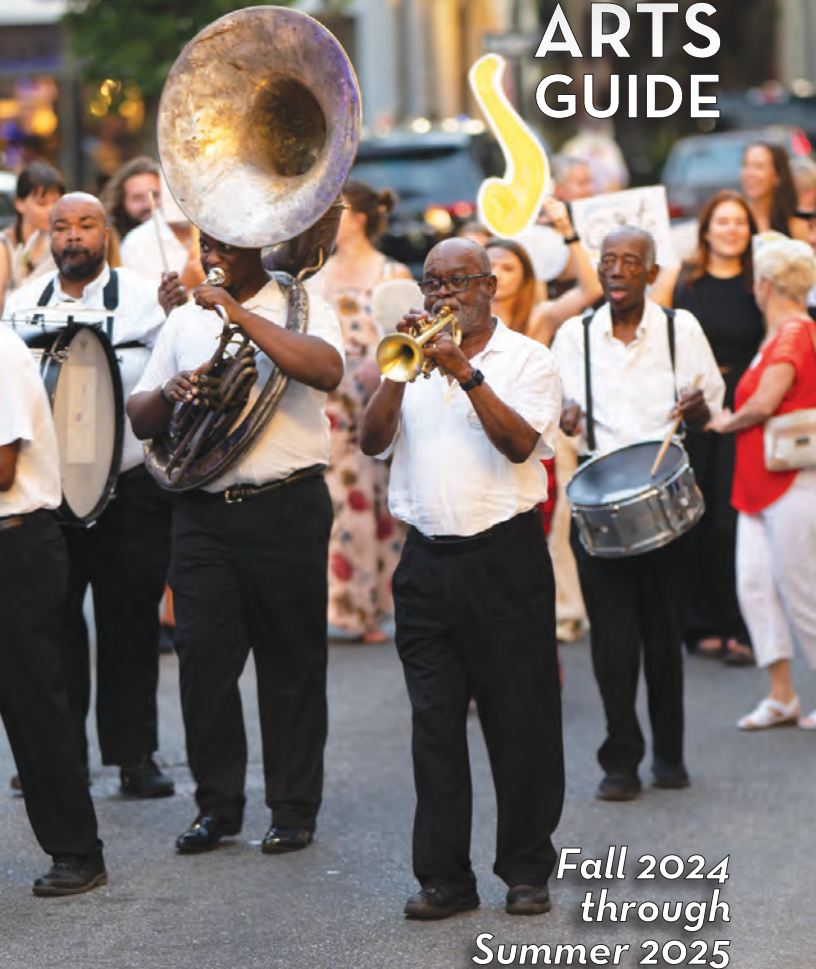

AFRICATOWN HERITAGE HOUSE

The Africatown Heritage House is open Tuesdays through Saturdays, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Clotilda: The Exhibition tells the story of the 110 remarkable men, women, and children from their West African beginnings to their enslavement, to their settlement of Africatown, and finally the discovery of the sunken schooner, through a combination of interpretive text panels, documents, and artifacts. Timed entry tickets are required.

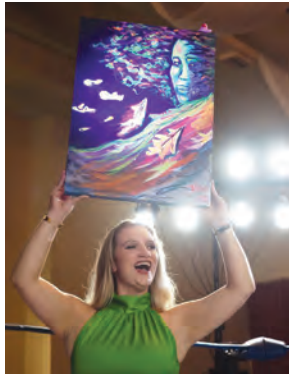
